WHY THE TEC CONGRESS?

EC is a community. Although it is organized, it is not an organization. It is a family built on the love and presence of Jesus. It is a bonding together of individuals who share the same faith vision and who strive to live Paschal Mystery spirituality. It is held together by graced love--a love that is generated by our love of one another as a reflection of the love of Christ for us.

Like all love relationships it is very fragile; to sustain its strength we need quality time together. Love grows and builds on mutual sharing and affirmation. The first reason why it is important to attend the TEC Congress is the person-to-person encounters that are shared there. Our very presence is a source of mutual support and affirmation. We become a living grace to one another. To maintain our commitment to the TEC Movement constantly requires this fresh experience of Paschal Love.

The second reason why it is important that we come to the TEC Congress is that we are engaged in a very complex work for God and the Church. The Manual provides us with a spiritual process and valuable insights into how to attract youth and young adults to embrace discipleship. But the very nature of our work in challenging youth to live the Christ-life demands that we constantly evaluate the effectiveness of our work. TEC leaders are constantly gleaning fresh

insights in facilitating the TEC spiritual process. The Congress is the place where we share them. All past members who have attended say they have come away much enriched.

The third important reason for coming is that our new Episcopal Moderator, Bishop William P. Callahan, OFM Conv., will be joining us at the Congress. Also the Founders and other historic leaders will attend. It will be a good opportunity to speak with them personally and to share your experiences in TEC and tap into their wisdom. As at a family reunion the younger will come to know the older leaders and both are enriched by the encounter.

Finally, TEC is always adjusting to new realities. It is a living Movement that responds to the needs of the persons it serves. Currently, the new challenge calls for the adjustment of TEC to the needs of young adults. While the essentials always remain the same, the spiritual guidelines by which they are realized may be carefully adjusted to blend well with the needs of young adults. It is a tribute to the TEC movement that young adult ministry sees TEC as an effective means of ministering to young adults. The Congress offers you an opportunity for input into this important new venture.
